

Designated lawyer report

Report guidelines

The purpose of this form is to assist designated lawyers with their reporting obligations under rule 11.4 of the Lawyers and Conveyancers Act (Lawyers: Conduct and Client Care) Rules 2008.

A designated lawyer for a law practice must notify the Law Society within 14 days under rule 11.4 if any person engaged or employed by the law practice is given a written warning or is dismissed by the law practice for conduct that amounts to bullying, discrimination, harassment, racial harassment, sexual harassment, theft or violence. A designated lawyer must also notify the Law Society if any person leaves the practice within 12 months of them being advised

that they were being investigated in relation to this type of conduct (except where an investigation has concluded that there were no grounds to report the matter under rules 2.8 or 11.4).
