- 2. All entries must be on the Official Entry Form and submitted in <a href="hardcopy">hardcopy</a>. Entries submitted electronically will not be accepted.
- 3. All questions must be answered, incomplete entry forms will not be accepted.
- 4. All entries must be accompanied by a <u>hard copy</u> of the article, preferably in its published form (electronic copies will not be accepted).
- 5. Where journals are provided, these will be returned if accompanied by a stamped addressed envelope or pre-paid courier bag.
- 6. Entries for the award open on Tuesday 4 April 2023 and close on Friday 30 June 2023. Entries received before or after these dates will not be accepted.
- 7. The number of entries from a single contributor or group of contributors is not limited, however, each entry must be submitted on the Official Entry Form.
- 8. Publishers may submit entries on behalf of authors however, each entry must still be accompanied by a fully completed Official Entry Form.
