

# Practising fee rebate application

#### Form information

If you work part time, you may be eligible for a rebate on your practising fee. You will need to wait until the commencement of the new practising year (1 July) before you can apply for a rebate for the previous practising year.

You will be entitled to apply for a rebate for the year ending 30 June, if:

- you have not received, more than \$50,000 total gross income (from all sources of income) for the tax year ended 31 March in the same year; and
- 2. you worked as a lawyer, on average, fewer than 20 hours a week in that period.

To qualify for the rebate, you are required to complete the statutory declaration and provide supporting documentation that your total gross income from all sources of income (including income received from government superannuation and/or government benefits) for the tax year 1 April to 31 March was less than \$50,000.

The rebate will be 50% of the practising certificate fee paid. The rebate applies only to the practising fee paid to the New Zealand Law Society (Law Society) for the period 1 July to 30 June and does not include Council of Legal Education Levy, Legal Complaints Review Office Levy, Inspectorate Fee or Fidelity Fund contribution.

An original or certified copy of your IRD summary of earnings showing total income received
